# ABOUT THE PROGRAM

The DSPG summer program provides students with the opportunity to learn and practice data science skills in service of the public. Participants will be trained on a range of data science tools, such as R, QGIS, Tableau, and GitHub as well as fundamental skills like writing database gueries, acquiring, blending, transforming, and visualizing data, research design, technical report writing, and stakeholder engagement. DSPG fellows and interns will work in teams to collaborate with research faculty and project stakeholders, including extension specialists and community leaders. The research teams will use their data science skills and domain expertise to address the complex and often pressing problems of our local, regional, and state partners.

The Extension and Outreach Geospatial Program and the College of Agriculture's Social Analytics Laboratory at Iowa State University are accepting applications for graduate fellows and undergraduate interns for the summer DSPG program.

The program will run for 10 weeks (May 18 - July 24) for both graduate fellows and undergraduate interns. Students from every discipline with quantitative/analytical skills are encouraged to apply. Students enrolled at any accredited college or university in Iowa are eligible to join our team, where they will learn how to use data science skills to help communities address local problems.
